All about Leo

How did you get into all things hair?

I started colouring my mum's hair at home when I was 14 years old because she went grey very early. By 19, I was at Vidal Sassoon.

What appealed to you about it?

I enjoyed the creative

side of it, but more than that, it made my mum feel really great about herself, and that was very rewarding.

Did you have a 'light bulb' moment, when you decided: "this is what I want to do!"

Yes! On my first ever visit to the London Vidal Sassoon Academy. I knew it the moment I walked in.

In terms of celebrities, who's got amazing hair?

Kirsty Gallagher and Abbey Clancy

What famous hair would you love to get your hands on the most?

Lady Gaga at a beauty shoot... but a real beauty shoot. No wigs or madness.

What inspired you to create your own range for Tesco?

All my experiences of working globally with the best of the best have given me an amazing insight into the quality and results that can be achieved with your hair if you get it right.

I wanted to give everyone the opportunity to experience that.

From that first experience of making my mum feel amazing in her hair, I have wanted to bring this experience to everyone. Everyone should be able to have what I look for in a professional product as a professional hairdresser. I wanted it to be accessible.

How to get great hair

What are the three hair care golden rules?

- 1 - Shampoo twice
- 2 - Treat hair on a regular basis with a mask
- 3 - Dedicate time for styling

Is it really necessary to shampoo twice?

Always because the first shampoo removes toxins and from the second shampoo you get all the benefits of the formula.

Do I have to condition my hair, even if it's oily?

What are the three things most people do wrong, when it comes to taking care of their hair?

1 - A lot of people misdiagnose their own hair type and texture. It's best to ask your hairdresser so you can buy products appropriately

2 - Shampoo only once

3 - People don't always have the right tools to achieve the best results

You have an impressive list of celeb clients - any gossip you care to share?

All my celeb clients are now very good friends of mine and are never too demanding. But Abbey Clancy's hair definitely takes a long time!

What's a super fast way to get hair from drab to fab?

Dry shampoo, shine spray, hairspray...done!

If I'm considering a new look for the New Year, what are the key things to bear in mind?

Is it going to suit you? Ask friends, loved ones and of course your stylist. Think of your style,

the clothes and make up you wear. And most importantly, is it going to be manageable.

Perkins

Perkins in Plumtree, Nottingham has been serving award winning food since 1982, so **trentbarton play** thought it was about time we paid a visit!

SPOTLIGHT ON

Perkins

Just South of Nottingham, in leafy Plumtree, Perkins is a bit of a hidden gem. Set in the beautifully restored old Plumtree railway station, Perkins benefits from a unique location and, with the perfect combination of light and bright, and cosy corners, it's an ideal spot for work do's, get together with friends, and romantic one on ones.

The menu is what I'd call classic Brit with a twist, and head chef Sarah Newham is clearly passionate about using local produce. In fact, Perkins even has its very own smokehouse, so items that have been smoked on the premises often feature. The restaurant also knows its wines, and offers an extensive menu, plus specialist spirits and real ales from the cask.

From the starter menu I tried the warm salad of bacon and mushrooms, topped with a poached egg deep fried in a parmesan crust – an unusual and, I imagine, difficult dish, that tasted delicious and was presented beautifully. I also tried the confit duck and dauphinoise terrine, which layered potato with pate for a tasty twist. Other choices on the starter menu included black pudding eggs benedict and the popular Perkins sleeper to share (a railway sleeper of tiger prawns, haloumi fritters and chorizo).

For mains I chose the duo of free range chicken, which consisted of poached chicken supreme and a chicken kiev, served with smoked bacon and cheese pomme Anna, and it was great to see something



different and exciting done with what can often be the 'boring' chicken dish. I also tried the steak, which was cooked to perfection, as well as the triple cooked chips in duck fat, which were another treat. Other options included 'A Taste of Pork' (pork fillet, black pudding and cheek fritters), wood pigeon lattice and fillet of plaice.

Of course, pudding had to be sampled in the interests of telling the full story, and I tried a deliciously gooey

chocolate and hazelnut torte, served with the best mango sorbet I've ever tasted. And I've tried a lot of sorbet!

Service was attentive without being overpowering and there is a good variety of table sizes and shapes to suit different types of party. The quality and inventiveness of the dishes make Perkins an ideal choice for a special occasion meal. However, if you're after a quality bargain bite, visit on a Monday for three courses and a free glass of house wine for just £18.75!

Friday nights at Perkins are steak nights, with four types of prime, local, 28 day aged cuts available, together with a selection of sides and sauces. They also do a posh Sunday lunch (three courses for £18.95) if you fancy starting and finishing your weekend with a real gourmet treat!

Despite being hidden away down a dramatic driveway off Station Road, Perkins is easy to get to on **keyworth connection**. You won't look out of place in your best outfit on **keyworth connection**, which boasts a stylish contemporary interior and sumptuous leather seats.

keyworth connection will take you from Nottingham Broadmarsh bus station to Perkins in under 15 minute, with buses running until midnight Sunday to Thursday and 3am Friday and Saturdays. This means that you can enjoy sampling that wine list, specialist spirits and real ales, and really make the most of your special meal out at Perkins.

Celebrity Recipe: Nadia Sawalha

TV cookery expert Nadia Sawalha has shared one of her favourite breakfast recipes with **trentbarton play**, so forget the toast and cornflakes and wake up to something new!



Ingredients

1 tbsp rapeseed oil
125g unsmoked back bacon
100g mushrooms, chopped
125g self raising flour
100g wholemeal plain flour
1 tsp baking powder
50g butter
30g cheese e.g. Cheddar or Cheshire, grated
100ml semi skimmed milk

Nadia Sawalha's Breakfast Scones

Nadia says "It's really important to me and my family to eat breakfast to help us get through the day. I love these delicious breakfast scones, they're so versatile. You can make them in advance, which is perfect for when I'm on the go, as I can just grab one as I rush out the door. They're great on their own or you can enjoy them with a variety of fillings."



Prep time: 10 minutes
Cook time: 10-15 minutes
Makes 10

Total cost: £2.74
Cost per serving: £0.27

Preheat the oven to 220C, gas mark 7. Grease a baking tray.

Heat the oil in a large frying pan and fry the mushrooms for 4-5 minutes until golden. Grill the bacon whole and chop the bacon into small pieces, roughly 1cm.

Mix the flours and baking powder in a large bowl and rub in

the butter until it resembles breadcrumbs. Stir in the bacon mixture and half the cheese. Mix in the milk to form a soft dough.

On a floured surface, roll out the dough to 2cm thick and, using a 6cm round cutter, cut out 10 scones and place on the tray. Sprinkle over the remaining cheese.

Bake for 10-15 minutes until golden. Perfect for eating on the go, wrapped in a napkin. The scones will keep for 2-3 days in an airtight container. The scones can also be frozen (best to freeze once cooled, on the day they have been baked) so you have a ready supply for busy weeks.

Top Tips

Serve spread with low fat cream cheese, sliced tomatoes or ham for a more substantial breakfast on the go.

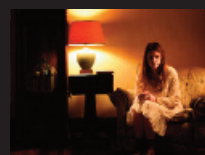

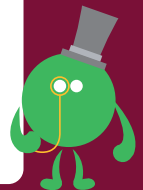

Fan Fave - Sean Romans

You made the move from your native New Zealand to Nottingham in 2011 – how was that?

I was playing rugby in New Zealand and I was looking for a change of scene. I always wanted to come to the UK and have a look around. I was fortunate to get that opportunity with rugby.

You and fellow New Zealander fly-half James Arlidge make a formidable team. Does the Kiwi connection come into play there?

I think we come from very similar backgrounds in terms of how we learnt the game so we are on the same page when it comes to different situations on the field. I find him really easy to play with, he is a class athlete and feel lucky to have him there. Between the two of us we don't have an accent; it is everyone else that sounds odd to us.

How did you get into rugby?

Initially I played football, which people over here would be shocked to find out. I played

that until I was 12 or 13. My dad was a pretty staunch rugby guy so when I hinted that I might make the move to rugby because my friends were playing, he was pretty quick to sign me up.

What have been your highlights of the season so far?

For me it was the first game against Leeds. We had high expectations of what we wanted to achieve this season and that first game of the season is always nerve wrecking because you are never too sure. We

got off to a slow start and were a few points down and I was really happy with how we came back and took that game.

And low points?

It would have to be what happened to Mitch Todd. (The Nottingham R. F. C. player died in a car crash last year). That put things in perspective in a big way. I guess that was the final gift from him, the fact that the

whole season was put into context quickly for us. It has allowed us to enjoy things more because you treasure what you have got when you see something taken away like that.

You've got some tough matches coming up including close rivals Bedford Blues in January and current top of the table Newcastle Falcons in March. Feeling confident?

They are the tough games you want to play. They matter, there is something on the line and it is a real test. Those are the teams we want to be tested against because we want to be one of them. The only way we can do that is to consistently perform against the best.

Rising Star - Jack Bradford

You came through the Nottingham Academy and are now being feted as a rising star at Nottingham Rugby Football Club. How did you find the Academy experience?

It was tough at times but it was worth it, even though we got beaten heavily sometimes. We gained that toughness and skill that you wouldn't gain playing against weaker teams.

You've been called up to play for the Scotland U17, U18 and U20 Six Nations team – how was that?

It was always a hectic time, being at school and

uni while playing. I had to go up to Scotland every other weekend and train. It was a great opportunity to see what international and elite rugby is like, and to get into that mindset. It was good for my development as a player and for my exposure.

Are you enjoying playing in the Rugby Union championship league?

It's tough - more physical and quicker than what I've played before. I still have a lot to learn and plenty more work to do on my skills. I can see myself playing in the Championship for a few years to come.

What have been your highlights of the season so far?

It is a close one between the Plymouth and Bristol wins. Maybe Bristol edges it because it was such a big win (63-7), I was on the pitch at the end and we celebrated together on the ground in front of a home crowd.

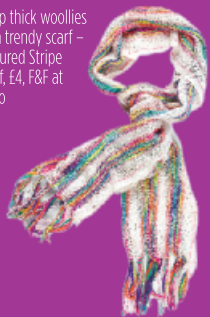

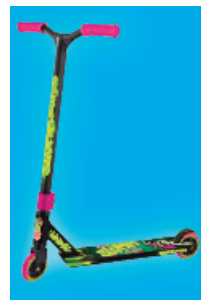

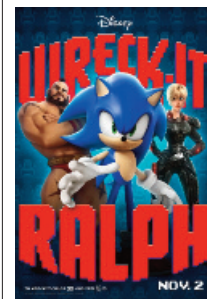
